### NOTICE

**Sub : Multiple fee structures for the students seeking admission against seats available for NRI and Institutional quotas in Unaided Private Professional Colleges imparting Health Science Courses.**

The Authority has received several Complaints from Stake-holders alleging that some of the Institutes imparting Health Science courses are demanding fees more than the maximum fees prescribed by the Authority from the students admitted under the Institutional/Management and NRI quota.

All concerned to take note that the Fees Regulating Authority in its meeting held on 19/3/2018 has resolved as under :

**"Sub: Multiple fee structures for the students seeking admission against seats available for NRI and Institutional quotas in Unaided Private Professional Colleges imparting Health Science Courses.**

**There is a practice of Private Professional Medical Colleges and other Institutions charging fees in multiples of the regular fees approved by the Fees Regulating Authority from the students admitted against NRI / institutional quotas. Issue has been discussed in depth and from all possible angles. Keeping in view the interests of managements and students community as a whole following decisions have been arrived at unanimously.**

- 1) We do not see any legal hurdle in approving on going practice of institutions / colleges imparting health science courses, applying





*different fee structures for the students admitted against NRI and Institutional quotas.*

- 2) *As regards quantum of fee structures, we consider that maximum limit shall be 5 times and 3 times for the students admitted against NRI and Institutional quotas respectively. Provided that the institutions before start of admission process shall be required to declare its fee structures for respective quotas, discipline wise / course wise on its website as well as on the website of Director, Medical Education and Research, Mumbai and Fees Regulating Authority.*
- 3) *Fes collected from the institutions from the students of above categories shall be reflected in the statement of Income and Expenditure of the institution. The Fees Regulating Authority shall consider it appropriately while approving the fee structure of the next academic year relating to that institution and for the particular course."*

The Authority in its meeting held on 7/8/2018 further resolved and clarified the decision dated 19/3/2018 as under:



*"Decision dated 19/3/2018 on the subject referred above shall be applicable to all health science courses conducted by unaided private professional colleges/institutes. Fee collected by such institute in multiple of the regular fees from the students admitted against NRI/institutional quotas should be reflected in the statement of income and expenditure for the particular financial year. In turn Fees Regulating Authority shall consider it as an income of the institute while approving fee structure of the given academic year."*

In view of the above-quoted decisions which are in force, the Unaided Private Professional Institutions imparting Health Science courses (except the PG courses in Medical Science), the Institutes admitting students under **the Institutional/Management quota can not charge fees more than 3 times the fees approved by the Authority for the regular students admitted under the Merit quota.** Similarly, for students admitted under the NRI quota, the




Institutions running Health Science courses can not charge fees more than 5 times the fees approved by the Authority for the regular students admitted under the Merit quota.

In view of the above, all concerned are directed to strictly follow the decision of the Authority prescribing upper limit of charging the fees to students admitted under Institutional/Management and NRI quota.

Decision :

Issue raised is, whether the decision dated 19/3/2018 on the subject of Multiple fee structures for the students seeking admission against seats available for NRI and Institutional quotas in Unaided Private Professional Colleges imparting health science courses and also applies to the fees structure of physiotherapy courses for the academic year 2018-19.

**It is resolved to issue following clarification:**

Decision dated 19/3/2018 on the subject referred above shall be applicable to all health science courses conducted by unaided private professional colleges/institutes. Fee collected by such institute in multiple of the regular fees from the students admitted against NRI/institutional quotas should be reflected in the statement of income and expenditure for the particular financial year. In turn Fees Regulating Authority shall consider it as an income of the institute while approving fee structure of the given academic year.
